

**Original 'Magic Sliders' offer best protection against scrapes
*Fix floor, furniture damage—before it happens***

You try to hide them, but every home has its share. Scratches across your beautiful hardwood floors from chairs, cabinets and other furnishings. Gouges in your tabletops caused by lamps, trivets and similar bric-a-brac. No one means to do it, but it happens, even with the best of care.

Fixing unsightly marks in floors and fine furniture can require professional help, and it can be expensive. Often, the damage is permanent. The only solution is prevention.

Fortunately for homemakers, there is a remedy for this all-too-familiar problem, and it's both inexpensive and easy to use.

Magic Sliders are thin, super-smooth Teflon-like wafers that attach to the bottoms of chair and table legs, cabinets and furniture or appliances you occasionally—or often—need to move. These wafers are so slippery, even a lightweight person can reposition heavyweight items like sofa beds, refrigerators and fully loaded armoires with just a push. And while they're helping to do this, they also prevent those furnishings from scratching your floors.

The unique, space-age technology of Magic Sliders reduces surface friction and allows these ultra-slick wafers to glide like ice cubes across a hot griddle. It almost doesn't matter how much weight you put on them—the largest sizes let you move a staggering 3,200 lbs. of dead weight over any surface including wood, vinyl, ceramic tiles and even carpeting, without breaking a sweat. Magic Sliders are far better than casters for moving furniture and superior to felt pads for protecting floors.

These "magic" little helpers come in many styles to fit all types of furniture, including square and triangular shapes for cabinets and several disc diameters for different-size chair, stool or table legs. There are even cup-shaped discs that enable you to temporarily position them under furniture legs for occasional use.

Smaller sizes may be placed under lamps, potted plants and similar items to protect tabletops as well. Depending on the style you choose, most Magic Sliders come packaged with double-sided tape, nails or screws for quick and easy installation (the popular new "grip tip" version requires no attachment hardware at all). Although this product has spawned numerous "knock-off" imitators, Magic Sliders are the original and still the best—more than 120 million have been sold to date. They come packaged in sets for just a few dollars each, and are available in most home-product stores such as hardware, home centers, and bed & bath retailers.
